## Kalkaska County Road Commission Monthly Meeting October 9, 2024

John Rodgers announced, "Meet the Crew", at the Road Commission facility on October 29<sup>th</sup>, from 11-5pm. A Mexican menu from La Gueru Cocina & Cantina.

During the agenda item Township representative, I asked John if he had any future plan to resurface West Bear Lake, a primary road. His response was the Township would have to pay 80% of the cost through existing funds or through a road millage. I mentioned the edges of the road is crumbling and breaking off.

Discussion on Riverview Road conditions caused by excessive heavy loads from logging vehicles. He stated there's more of a possibility Riverview could see resurfacing before West Bear Lake Road.

According to John Rodgers the approximate cost of a two-inch overlay with shoulder improvements is \$130,000 a mile not including administrative cost and legal expenses. Depending on existing conditions on any of our paved roads, the cost of road repairs and improvements have skyrocketed. A road millage of one mill generates approximately \$56,000 dollars. It would take several years to fund a project with costs rising every year.
